WOLF CREEK INDIAN VILLAGE TO HOST 4TH ANNUAL FAMILY DAY EVENT Celebrating 20 years

Bastian, VA - Wolf Creek Indian Village will be celebrating the Native American culture with their annual Family Day Event. Many activities are planned throughout the day. The event will feature entertainment by the Native American drum group the Red Fire Singers. Flute player Larry Quesenberry will also perform. Visitors can walk through the village and enjoy many demonstrations of primitive skills, such as basket and pottery making. Flintknapper, Jeff Payne, will be on hand to demonstrate the making of arrowheads. Children's activities will include face painting, bracelet making, and make-a-bead/trade-a-bead. Local artisan vendors will be on hand with many handcrafted and one-of-a-kind items, such as jewelry, pottery, and moccasins. Local author Kim Headlee will also be available for book signing.

Family Day will be held on Saturday, June 4th at Wolf Creek Indian Village. The village will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. with most of the event activities beginning at 10 a.m. and lasting to 4 p.m. Special event pricing of \$7.00 per person for adults ages 18 and up, and the pricing for children ages 5 to 17 is \$5.00 per child. Children ages 4 and under are free.

"This event was created four years ago as a way to give locals visitors who have visited the village before an opportunity to come back and participate in something different from the tours we have available daily. Family Day has evolved to being an event that now has a little something for everyone in the family and appeals to those that are new visitors as well as those who are returning." explained Jaime Williams, General Manager at Wolf Creek.
